A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERVISOR

Welcome to the start of a New Year!

By the time this message reaches you, winter has begun. Please be mindful of children that may be playing near the roads or on the snowbanks.

As most of you are aware, a committee was put together to develop solar guidelines and regulations. We have enacted a local solar law thanks to the hard work of the committee and the input of residents who attended the meetings. We are now in the process of working on enacting battery storage (solar) and recycling of solar equipment laws. A second public comment session was held on December 28, 2022 at 6:15 p.m. to gather additional input from the residents. We will continue to keep residents updated regarding solar via the town's website.

As a continued update, a reminder that motorized vehicles (4-wheelers dirt bikes, and snowmobiles) are not allowed on town property/trails. As you are well aware, there is a local law prohibiting this activity on the trails. If you are caught on the trails with a motorized vehicle, the Town will pursue all legal remedies.

In closing, take time to enjoy the resources the town offers as well as attend a board meeting. Your thoughts and opinions matter to us. We will begin grooming the trails in the park system, so please take the time to enjoy them.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT



The Highway Department hopes everyone has a great holiday season and everyone is in good

health. With winter getting a slow start this year, the Highway Department would like to remind everyone as winter gets started to please drive with caution; road temperatures are varying and can cause slick spots on the roadways. As the snow piles up, the Highway Department has a few reminders for everyone. Please keep cars off the street during overnight hours. This helps the Highway Department clear the streets more efficiently. In May 2009, our town adopted local law # 1-2009 which states that parked or abandoned vehicles on any public highways in the Town of Deerfield during snow storms, floods, fires, or other public emergencies can be removed at the owner's expense. As winter starts out, we ask that residents do not push snow across the road. As winter progresses in the next few months, snow plowed across the road builds up and takes up part of a lane in the road so traffic needs to go around it, PLEASE DO NOT PUSH SNOW ACROSS THE ROADWAY.

This could cause an accident, and the person pushing the snow in the road could be held liable. With winter weather just starting out, keep in mind the type of tires you have on your car. All season tires are not the best tires in snow and ice; snow tires work the best in the winter months. Please keep trash cans clear of the curb so the plow won't knock them over. When winter snowbanks start to get higher, our children like to play in them and dig tunnels. Please remind them how dangerous this can be, as the plow drivers can't see them and we would not want to see any of our children get hurt.

We hope everyone had a fun filled summer and enjoyed the nice summer weather we had this year. The Highway Department had a very ambitious road construction season planned but was cut short with one very large reconstruction project on two miles of road. When the 2022 summer construction season came to a close, the Highway Department still had projects to get to and things to finish. When the winter snow melts, we will be out to finish the things we could not get to before the snow came in 2022. The Highway Department is planning another busy year in 2023. We will be splitting the construction season between maintenance projects and construction projects in 2023. We were slow getting around town with the leaf vacuum our old leaf vacuum is a very slow operation. The town had a new vacuum on order but did not show up until late November. After the snow fell on them, it was a very hard process collecting them but I think we picked up most of them. We will be around at spring clean-up to get any we missed.

The Highway Department's trash collection site at the firehouse and the Highway Garage have worked out and has been well attended. We are going to continue having Saturday drop off times in 2023. Trash can be brought to the Town Highway Garage during our normal work hours throughout the year; just call ahead so we can have someone there to help you load items into the dumpster. The Highway Department business hours are M-F 7:00AM to 3:30 PM. Please do not drop off trash items after hours. Green waste can also be brought to the Highway Garage any time and can be put in the designated area.

We would like to thank everyone for a good year in 2022 and look forward to a great year in 2023. Thanks to all who remembered the Highway Department during the holidays with the thoughtful cards, Christmas cookies, and food sent to us. It is nice to know we are appreciated.



My office will be accepting Tax Payments, while also continuing with the normal duties of the town. Much of what the Clerk's office handles can be done via postal mail, phone and sometimes email. History in the making! Kids, imagine this for a moment. Pictured here is your school. Basically, a 1 room house with a wood stove as heat, no running water, or HOT water, and the water came from a local spring when someone, whomever was assigned the task, filled the water jug. In 1928-29 there were about 30 students and only ONE Teacher for all grades and ages! The students were all neighbors that lived within a couple of miles from what was known as District #7 Poplar Tree School, from 1849-1949, on Harris Rd (off Walker Rd, on top of the hill).

Take a drive by this local piece of history while you can. The former Washburn residence may soon be razed for a new, more modern residence.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION



Kindergarten Registration for the 2023-2024 school year will be held one day only on the following date at Deerfield Elementary School:

THURSDAY, JANUARY 26, 2023

To be eligible to enter kindergarten in September 2023, a child must be 5 years of age **on or before December 1,2023** and must reside in the Whitesboro Central School District. You must bring proof of age (birth certificate); and proof of residency: including *three* (3) of the following: National Grid, telephone bill, current NYS driver's license, oil/propane delivery bill, cable bill, insurance bill, and/or paystub. Immunization records must be presented at the time of registration.


