WHEREAS, the Town Board adopted Local Law No. 1 of 2023 entitled the "Town of Deerfield Battery Storage Systems Law" which provided for the regulation of Battery Storage Systems within the Town; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the Planning Board a proposed moratorium on the applications or proceeding or the issuance of permits or approvals for the construction of Battery Storage Systems has been submitted to the Town Board for its review and comment so as to provide the Planning Board time to determine if regulation of such uses is necessary; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of a moratorium by local law requires that the Town Board conduct a public hearing prior to its filing with the Secretary of State to solicit comments from the public; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the possible adoption of a Local Law, the Town Board, consistent with the State Environmental Quality Review Act, will declare itself as the presumptive lead agent for the purpose of evaluating the environmental impacts, if any, resulting from the possible adoption of the Local Law; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the proposed Local Law should be submitted to the Oneida County

Department of Planning in accordance with the General Municipal Law, and SEQRA Regulations as well
as adjacent municipalities including the Town of Marcy and the City of Utica to solicit their comments;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, in connection with the possible adoption of regulations relating to short term rentals, the Town Board shall act as presumptive lead agent for the purposes of SEQRA, and in connection therewith directs that a copy of the proposed Local Law be forwarded to all interested

agencies including the Town of Marcy, the City of Utica and to the Oneida County Department of Planning together with a request that they provide any comments concerning the proposed Local Law; and be it further

Section 1 Title

The title of this Local Law, which includes amendments to the Town of Deerfield Zoning Ordinance, shall be known as "Town of Deerfield Short Term Rental Ordinance"

Section 2 Purpose

The purpose of this Local Law is to align with Section 1.03 of the Town of Deerfield Zoning Ordinance, specifically Section 1.03A and 1.03G.

The Zoning Ordinance is based on the Town of Deerfield Comprehensive Master Plan. It is the intent of this Ordinance to implement the Comprehensive Master Plan by regulating the use of land, buildings and structures to promote the public health, safety and general welfare by accomplishing the following:

Section 1.03A- Accommodate and promote land uses which are compatible with the Town's character and conserve the property values and long term stability of residential neighborhoods, agricultural areas, commercial districts and special districts.

Section 1.03G- Establish controls over potential conflicting land uses and uses which may need special regulations as special land uses to be compatible with surrounding development patterns and zoning.

Section 3 Findings

Deerfield is truly a bedroom community and has been so since North Utica was annexed by the City of Utica in 1916. This was the prime commercial area of the Town, along with Riverside Center, which continues to be the primary shopping location for residents. With the exception of Bank of America Center, there are no major companies located in Town. The result is that the land uses and quality of life in Deerfield are primarily centered around residential properties and neighborhoods. Comprehensive Master Plan page 11

Commercial growth shall only be allowed in locations which do not impact adjacent residential neighborhoods or areas where development is anticipated. Comprehensive Master Plan page 57





- 1) As of the first warm rainfall the frost started coming out, unfortunately brought out the potholes with it.
- 2) Going to be renting a screening plant for the millings we have stored at Broadacres. We will be using millings to pave some of out gravel roads also shoulder back up material.
- 3) F550 is rotted out and the roof is leaking. We use this truck for the parks in the summer months. Should we be thinking about another vehicle?
- 4) NYS salt contract, problems getting road salt going to a meeting at the County DPW. No new information but did get a few loads delivered. Don't know what is going to happen in the remainder of the contract in 2025. Going forward Oneida County Highway Superintendents Association and the cities met with Oneida County DPW on a plan for the 2026 season. NYS is looking for salt tonnage from the towns by May 1st. Rumor in the industry is the major players are not interested in bidding state contracts for 2026. Oneida county may try and bid their own contract for winter salt. Cost will be up
- 5) Schuyler water project is moving forward, sent the project plans to us for comment.
- 6) Getting some reports of roads getting narrow are going to be working on removing some snowbanks. Pushed back snow in the development areas, was not well received. Residents did not want the snow pushed up on their lawns. Looking into possibly buying a snow blower for the skid-steer. Received cost estimates on a snow blower for the skid steer. 10,000
- 7) Working on 284 agreement costs for 2025. Meeting with paving companies on estimates for paving projects.

8)MS4 annual report has been submitted to NYS. New requirements on the DEC permit are going to require the town to have more storm water training for the Highway department and Building inspector with more documentation.

- 9) Started working on repairing plow damage at the municipal building and town park getting ready for the season. We will be turning the water back on around the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ of May.
- 10) Sweepers are out sweeping up winter sand on the roads.

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
